A PROGRAM DELIVERING HIGH QUALITY INCLUSIVE ARTS FOR ADULTS WITH ID/DD

LAUNCHED IN 1998, H'art Studio facilitates artistic skill building and creation-based workshops led by trained, professional local artists and arts educators for adults with developmental and intellectual disabilities.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Several times recognized in the Senate of Canada by Hon. Patricia Bovey for our contributions as she spoke in support of Bill C-81 Accessible Canada Act
- Performed dozens of plays to over 1000+, including at the Isabel Bader Human Rights Arts Festival in 2018
- Established a memorandum of understanding with the Faculty of Education at Queen's University and H'art artists audited courses taught by Kim Renders (theatre), Ben Bolden (music), and others
- Wrote and illustrated a series of children's books
- Shared experience with media arts and assistive technology at the Michaëlle Jean Foundation's Power of Arts National Forum
- Received a standing ovation from Lt. Governor of Ontario Hillary Weston and presented at the International Summit for Social Inclusion in Montreal

LAUNCHED IN 2012, with support from 40 private donors, THE BOX aims to create a versatile and inclusive performing arts community. THE BOX invites a diverse population to develop, produce and present their endeavours to the public and supports partnerships, co-productions and the sharing of expertise.

THE BOX A closer look at the Able Artists series

H'art began hosting the Able Artists series, an ongoing series of talks, performances and workshops by professional Canadian artists with disabilities and leaders in the inclusive arts movement in 2011. The Box was inspired by our struggle to find accessible public stages and venues to share the work of these incredible artists.

- Nominated for the 2017 City of Kingston Celebrating Accessibility Award (Dramaturgies of Translation)
- Hon. David Onley, Lieutenant Governor of Ontario provided an opening address

THE A PROGRAM ACCELERATING THE GROWTH OF INCLUSIVE ARTS IN KINGSTON AND BEYOND

LAUNCHED IN 2022, The Mix is a new program that supports D/deaf and disability artists as well as inclusive arts facilitators, emerging inclusive arts groups, and community groups. The Mix supports efforts to deliver workshops, develop works, rehearse, train, and collaborate. The Mix is about fostering best practices, learning together, and collaboration.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Ran a successful fundraising campaign with the community doubling our modest goal of \$30,000
- Completed an ambitious 16-week "build-in" on time
- Welcomed two resident theatre companies to the space and one emerging inclusive arts group

RECENT ACHIEVEMENTS

- PeerLess Productions developed and rehearsed their new play, We're All in Jeopardy
- Invited 10 inclusive arts studios from across Canada to participate in Connecting Canadians, with our partner the Marine Museum of the Great Lakes
- Over 50 local artists and volunteers completed training and practicums through The Mix
- Welcomed Let's Make Music, Ollin Kingston to The • Mix and renowned chefs Clark and Laurie Day who will pilot an inclusive culinary arts program

THE MIX A closer look at our training

SINCE 1998, H'art has trained volunteers, placement students, community artists and arts educators. In 2018, we formalized our approach with MixAbilities Inclusive Arts Training Program and it is now offered as part of The Mix program. First recommended by educator Bonnie Henderson, our training program was shaped by former board member Peter Wolf (Associate Vice-Provost, Teaching & Learning, Queen's University) and graduate student Sarah Carroll (MA International Education) with input from H'art's Education Director Anita Boldt. Our training has created a growing roster of qualified individuals locally and nationally.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Beta Testing completed by facilitator Karen Dolan
- Featured on ArtBridges, a community-engaged arts and arts for social change hub and forum
- Received the City of Kingston's 2018 Celebrating Accessibility Award in the category of Education

RECENT ACHIEVEMENTS

- Trained 50+ volunteers, field placement students, and community artists since official launch
- With OAC support, we developed our capacity to expand the program to wider arts community and to introduce our expertise at our upcoming national conference

THE MIX A closer look at our outreach

SINCE 2017, we have been engaging a roster of community artists and volunteers in an effort to reach out to under-served people with disabilities. These Mix artists bringing meaningful arts-based programming to the community. Our recent focus has been seniors with disabilities in long-term care homes. The effort has raised awareness of the value of meaningful inclusive arts endeavours among long-term care staff.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Completed two years of pilot testing at H'art Centre
- Delivered workshops over three years engaging Fairmount Home, Rideaucrest, & Providence Manor
- Offered Parkinson's Dance at Conservatory Pond
- Equipped four wards at Fairmount with Smart TVs, headsets, and inclusive arts & culture programming manuals developed by Michelle Clarabut, Ph.D.

RECENT ACHIEVEMENTS

- Offered free workshop in The Mix space in 2022
- Introduced the Weekend Arts Mixer project (WAM!) at Fairmount resulting in better access to meaningful inclusive arts on weekends. Seven facilitators and volunteers delivered 37 weekend arts workshops and involved more than 800 senior residents, family members and visitors in meaningful inclusive arts
- Encouraged more intergenerational connection and fun!
